CIESPI



CIESPI is a research and reference center dedicated to studies and on-theground projects about children and youth, and their families and communities. Our goal is to impact public policy and practices to benefit this population, thereby contributing to the promotion of children's rights and the development and wellbeing of youth in general.

National and International Actions – Exchange of knowledge

CIESPI is an international center operating in Brazil, with ample actions and partnerships established in various other countries. Since its foundation in 1984, CIESPI has been developing exchanges in the areas of research and training, with governmental and non-governmental organizations throughout Brazil and in different countries. The center operates largely through active participation in research networks focused on public policy seeking to ensure the rights of children and adolescents. Internationally, the main activity in recent years has been as a member of the Childwatch International Network, based in Oslo, Norway. The CIESPI team is particularly active in Childwatch-Latin America. Another important activity is the development of research projects, coordinated with the Department of Social Service of PUC-Rio and through agreements established with institutions in other countries, such as the University of Guadalajara in Mexico. In 2011 negotiations will be underway for CIESPI to sign agreements with Ostfold University in Norway, the National University of the South in Argentina, and Equity for Children, Latin America.



The project's primary goal was to evaluate the implementation of the Statute and publish the results of this research in partnership with the Secretary of Human Rights (SDH), through the Secretary for Promoting the Rights of the Child and Adolescent (SPDCA).

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This project aims to analyze the processes of public policies for children and adolescents in street situations in the city of Rio de Janeiro. The project includes advising and documenting the work of the Basic Policies Commission of the Municipal Council for the Rights of Children and Adolescents in Rio de Janeiro (CMDCA-RJ), and the creation and monitoring of guidelines for public policies related to children and adolescents in street situations.

In 2010, the project team worked in collaboration with eight other states, covering all of Brazil's regions: São Luis (MA), Salvador (BA), Olinda/Recife (PE), Goiânia (GO), Vitória (ES), Porto Alegre (RS), Manaus (AM), and São Paulo (SP). The project also includes the creation of a database with indicators, thus increasing the capacity of CIESPI to support public policies.

The Database "Childhood and Youth in Numbers" can be found on CIESPI's website. It contains information about child and adolescent populations in vulnerable situations in Brazil, along with other indicators.





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Early Childhood in Urban Brazil



This project aims to develop policy guidelines to expand opportunities for the comprehensive development of children in early childhood in urban Brazil. The main objective is to produce and publicize tools to help key actors promote and prioritize activities that benefit children from the ages of 0 to 6 years.

The project focuses on key areas and fundamental aspects of human development in early childhood, such as education, health, environment, culture and leisure (spaces where children live and play). These areas are considered through a comprehensive perspective with the tools produced through this project. In 2010 the first of four tools was developed in this project.

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Children and Adolescents: Citizen Participation, Public Policy and New Paradigms



This project is part of a line of research coordinated by Professor Irene Rizzini that is linked to the National Research Council (CNPq). The objective is to produce knowledge about the participation of children and adolescents in contemporary societies. It has been developed by a network of 11 researchers from four countries (Brazil, South Africa, India and England), aiming to build theories that can contribute to understanding youth participation. The network was formed during an international seminar on child and youth participation, held in Edinburgh in September 2006. In April 2009, the group held a first meeting in Cape Town, South Africa, to suggest courses of study on the issue of participation. In April 2010, an international seminar was held in Brazil, coordinated by the CIESPI team and the Social Service Department at PUC-Rio.

This project aimed to systematize and publicize qualitative and quantitative data on children and adolescents with disabilities, in order to increase their visibility and inclusion as subjects of rights. The main objective was to organize, analyze and publicize data to help improve the formulation of public policies and social practices. Through the systematization of data produced in the last ten years, the living conditions of Brazilian children and adolescents with disabilities can be better evaluated, and strategies to ensure their rights as citizens and social inclusion can be proposed and promoted.

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The family in relation to assistance programs for children and adolescents with mental disorder and / or mental disabilities: promoting the right to family



This research project aims to examine ways of promoting the right to family life for children and adolescents with mental disorders and / or mental disabilities. The main focus was to interview families about the care and treatment of their children, as well as access to services and other forms of support. In the past, institutions were seen as a solution to the problem. Today, while the importance of avoiding institutionalization is more widely recognized, and there are some initiatives to change these norms, much remains to be done to ensure the right to family life for these children and adolescents.

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The Rocinha Playroom and Cultural Center was created and developed through a partnership between the CIESPI and professionals in education and culture of Rocinha. The center was started with the Play and Learning Network project (2002) and actions initiated by the Center for Assistance to the Popular Movement (CAMPO). The project's main goal is to build collectively a space for discussion, research and action that values history, memory, culture, and educational practice in Rocinha, with play as an axis. Approved in 2005 by the Ministry of Culture as a "Cultural Spot, the project is now part of national networks in collaboration with Youth Actions, the Viva School, and Play City (Ludicidade). The Center is a founding member of the Forum of "Cultural Spots" of Rio de Janeiro and Espirito Santo and a member of the National Commission for Cultural Spots.

The Center's team operates with a methodology founded in play, participation and articulation. The project considers playing to be an important channel of communication between different ages, ethnicities, religions and backgrounds, stimulating formative interactions for children and other participants in the Center.

In 2010 the following project activities can be highlighted: the expansion of the partnership with Cultural Spots in the State of Rio de Janeiro and Sao Paulo; the strengthening of a partnership with the *Adolescentro* Paulo Freire in Rocinha, linking health and culture; the participation of youth "live cultural agents" from the Center in making the video *Views about the 20 years of the Statute of Children and Youth*, available at http://rocinhaludica.blogspot.com.
